The President's Challenge is an opportunity to recognize young people for their outstanding service to the community. Any SMA student who performs 26 (ages 5-10) or 50 (ages 11-15) or more hours of service will be recognized for their efforts with a pin bearing the Presidential Seal, a certificate, and a letter of recognition from the President. Hours are measured over a 12-month period and are cumulative. St. Michael the Archangel proudly covers the fees involved with this program as gratitude and recognition for the countless hours our students spend serving our community.

Keeping Track of Service Hours:

Students wishing to earn a service award will need to log and track their own service hours from April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025. **They must complete the application above and submit it with the Student Service Log and turn it into the school office (including parent signatures and totals) by Friday, April 4, 2025.**

What Qualifies as Service Hours?

"Community Service" is defined as **unpaid time** spent by the student on a *service activity that has a significant impact on meeting the needs of the community*, outside of immediate family. It includes volunteering for any religious, school, or community organization. There must be no compensation for the work, unless that compensation is donated or de minimus (e.g. small thank you gift card). *Awards are only for service, charitable support is not a factor considered for the award.*

Examples include: VBS Volunteer, parish picnic, fish fries volunteer or baker, MOYC volunteer, meals for priests, baking treats for police/firefighters, soup kitchens, not-for-profit work (e.g. working a 5K run or charity carnival), hospitals, shelters, Harvesters, nursing homes, blood drives, Environmental Clean-Up, assembling military or disaster relief kits, Gardening Angels, helping an elderly neighbor with trash, parish choir, altar serving, etc.

NOTE: Normal participation in youth organizations such as scout meetings (except specific service projects), field trips, camp-outs, babysitting siblings, or doing extra chores at home, do NOT qualify.
